Statues, Sculptures, and Monuments

- The Holocaust Memorial: is the history of the Holocaust, from 1933-1945, along with pictorial depictions of events and experiences from that time.
- Flagler Memorial Monument: is sited on a man-made island in Biscayne Bay, between Miami Beach and Miami. Built in 1920-21 by Carl Fisher.
- <u>Pillar of History</u>: This pillar is by Cuban Artists Manuel Carbonell and narrates the lives of the Tequesta Indians, Miami's first inhabitants.
- <u>Cuban Memorial Boulevard</u>: Take a stroll along the boulevard commemorating those who fought and died in the Cuban Revolution.
